Imagine living under a pile of your own stinking, filthy hair with roaches running all over you and your food. The life of a hoarding dog is terrible, and when the human cavalry arrives things often get worse because the local pound is full, and you and all your mates are immediately euthanized!

This summer we intervened to save hundreds of hoarding dogs when local pounds were full. Hoarding cases in East Texas, West Texas, down on the border, and more have flooded our kennels. Our network of partners in 43 states and Canada have had to act fast to find loving homes in a hurry.

Hoarding animals are highly stressed from living in a very small area where there is a pecking order that forces competition for food. Usually they are kept in the house in despicable conditions.

We make sure each dog will get the chance to receive all the love they need. They'll be properly fed and looked after. They will be treated as something special by people who love them dearly. They will blossom from fearful and withdrawn into loving and playful pets.

After each animal receives a complete vet check, proper vaccinations, and proper documentation for their destination, we send them off to happy lives they could never have imagined. Our partners receiving the dogs screen every new home, and every animal will find a new home. In fact, many have homes waiting when they arrive. Amazingly, their destinations are places that have a major shortage of pets because of very strict breeding and spay/neuter laws.

When a hoarder dies, there is usually no one to provide even short term care for animals. Our rapid response saved 35 dogs in the horrible heat. While the dogs were living in terrible conditions in the Piney Woods of East Texas, their owner had evidently spent all his money on keeping them fed and healthy (but not clean). Wow!
