Massive Hoarding Cases! Huge Medical Bills! Inflation!

After 26 Years, Will This be Our First Year to Run Into a Deficit?

2024 is the first year we've been in danger of coming up short....thousands of dollars short at that! For nearly 26 years, Rescue the Animals, SPCA has "made" its budget every year.

We won't come close in 2024 without your help! Please help our animals today.

We can't bear the thought of refusing the next big group of animals from abuse cases.

We just worked a big hoarding case that has brought us over 30 poor little dogs that were living in an actual hell (read about them inside). Their arrival follows earlier cases that brought over 80 dogs from hoarding cases, and abandonment cases that totaled over 100 more dogs.

The problem with all these cases is that we must act instantly or the animals will go to kill shelters in small rural towns that have no alternative but to euthanize them at once. Again and again we are the only group that will take the animals because.....

Every one of these animals must have a full medical exam including teeth, eyes, stool sample, and more. Blood is drawn for heartworm tests. X-Rays are often needed to check both old and new injuries. Preventative antibiotics are often given to the whole herd if one or two seem sick. Many will have more serious untreated problems. Everyone needs vaccinations.

We have homes waiting, BUT we will spend up to \$15,000 on the 30 dogs in our most recent seizure before they reach our partner groups for new homes.

Unfortunately, we can't budget ahead on cases like these because we never know when they will happen or how bad they will be. This year they ran us over!

BUT we have not had to turn away any abuse cases, vet! Your donation today will make sure we can keep taking every possible animal. Please ask your pet loving friends to help too!
