# Could just two people really make a difference?

In 1998 Paul Washburn and Kay Johnson found a Golden Retriever at the Abilene Animal Shelter and could not bear to see him die. At the time thousands and thousands of animals were dying at the shelter each year, and no animal was allowed to live there for over three days. Only 15% of incoming animals left alive!


Paul and Kay built a temporary kennel at their place of work and took Jake to safety only to find neighborhood kids walking him down North First Street a few hours later after breaking him out!

A larger kennel was built and soon several more dogs called a local mobile home park storage yard home until they could find families. This was the start of Rescue the Animals SPCA in 1998. An early problem was soon confronted with Kay telling her partner in crime that she might have to visit the pound alone if he continued to cry on every visit! Others soon volunteered and things began to happen.

A nonprofit was quickly created, and Kay's son Colby developed one of the first websites in the nation to post pound cats and dogs for adoption. Every week each animal was photographed and put on the web. Soon KTXS TV agreed to video animals at the shelter each week beginning a 25 year tradition that continues today. KEAN radio's Rudy Fernandez joined the team with PSA spots and weekly promotions as well.

For the first time people could actually see what beautiful cats and dogs were dying every day at the local pound. We paid for advertising for the pound, and adoptions soared.





In 2001, Dr. Allen Bolt opened a new practice in Abilene and started construction of his new building. Since Rescue the Animals did not have a building, he agreed to house cats and dogs from the pound and offer them for adoption. He built additional rooms for these animals. Rescue the Animals bought used stainless steel cages, and soon hundreds of animals each year were leaving the pound for medical work, a safe place to stay and ultimately new homes. We saved up to 1,000 animals a year this way.

In 2007, we purchased the Pampered Pet Inn and the Elm Creek Vet clinic to create our Rescue the Animals, SPCA center that is now one of the largest hubs in America for transporting animals to 43 states and Canada.

# 1st In Supporting the Abilene Animal Shelter

For 25 years we have taped animals at the shelter for KTXS TV as well as featuring them on KEAN radio and our social media.

# 2005 "We'll Build a FREE City Shelter" ... City Said "NOOO!"

We spent two years raising millions to build a new City of Abilene Animal Shelter and donate it FREE to the city. The City of Abilene said, "NO" tabling the proposal without debate! Today we are partnering with All Kind and helping with the construction of the new shelter.

# **2000** 1st Mobile Adoption Trailer in West Texas

Thanks to a grant through the Community Foundation our adoption trailer has saved thousands of animals over the years.

### 2007-2015 1st Low Cost Spay/Neuter Clinic in West Texas


In late 2007 we hired a part time vet to do spay/neuter and low cost vaccinations. We fixed thousands of cats and dogs and vaccinated thousands more. The program ended in 2015 when we no longer had a vet.

# **2011** Named First in America!

We were chosen most outstanding humane group in the nation by the Animal League America, the world's largest no-kill adoption organization.

# 2015 1st Transportation and Rehab Hub for Interstate Shipments

We have one of the largest transportation and rehab operations anywhere sending 1,500 to 2,000 Texas animals a year to our partners in 43 states and Canada through our Pets On the GO Network. We do not adopt locally to avoid competing with the Abilene Shelter



# **1st In Fighting Animal Abuse**

We are the only group that works with law enforcement all over West Texas and beyond to investigate animal abuse and take abused animals for medical treatment and placement in new homes. We have two investigators and offer rewards in abuse cases.







# Our Investigation Saved 218 Animals. West Texas Largest Animal Seizure!

# 1st Free Animal Abuse Investigator Schools in West Texas

We bring instructors to Abilene to train law enforcement officers all over West Texas for FREE. When we started, there was only one law enforcement officer in our 20 county area certified as an abuse investigator. We have trained over 100 more including two of our staff to fight animal abuse every day.

# **2010** Horse Disaster in West Texas



The Great Recession left starving horses everywhere. At one point that summer we were investigating and assisting law enforcement with over 100 horses in danger. Many came to us for rehoming.



# **2017** We saved 300 Hurricane Harvey dogs

and delivered over 3 tons of food to Houston. Our partners in Texas, Iowa, and Indiana all brought big loads of dog food. Jackson Brothers took donations. We also took some dogs from Louisiana.
